Our internship program is highly developed and well-regarded in the community for our dedication to the professional development of students and the opportunity for hands-on experience. Past interns appreciate the critical skills and knowledge they gained at Family Futures as they embark on careers in the nonprofit and private sector.

Internship Opportunities

- **Non-profit Accounting (1):** This internship provides experience in accounts payable, accounts receivable, payroll, bookkeeping, computer skills, and may include program specific budgeting and preparation for various reports.
- **Violence Prevention (2):** Throughout Kent County, Family Futures provides educational sessions to diverse audiences on a wide variety of topics, helping to create a more informed community that is invested in prevention. This intern will support programming by being organized and dedicated to outreach.
- **Childhood and Community Development (3):** These interns support families in Kent County through the use of the Ages and Stages Questionnaire (ASQ), a child developmental screening tool. The purpose of this free and voluntary program is to provide parents with valuable information about their child's development and community resources. All interns will assist in the day to day operations of Connections with emphasis in the following areas:
 - **Childhood Development (2):** This intern will be the lead for following up correspondence with our Connections parents and assisting with the seasonal newsletter.
 - **Foster Care (1):** Implement social-emotional development component of Connections with foster care agencies.
- **Community Intern (2):** The Community Partnership intern will have the opportunity to work in a diverse early childhood environment, sharing time between Early Learning Neighborhood Collaborative (ELNC) and Family Futures' Connections program
- **Communications (2):**

 - **Marketing (1):** Includes fund development, event planning and brand management and programming. The intern will gain experience in print design, web content editing, copywriting, public relations, fund development, and project management.
- **Nonprofit Administration (1):** This is a unique internship for those seeking experience in a leadership position, where skills like time management, community collaboration, project management, and organization are key.
- **Social Services Program Administration (1):** Healthy Start is a unique primary prevention collaborative for supporting parents in Kent County that is coordinated through Family Futures. Gain practical experience in the area of social work program management.
- **Volunteer Services (1):** Gain knowledge and experience in the general principles of prevention and non-profit work along with volunteer management best practices, relationship building, and project coordination.
- **Fund Development (1):** This intern will work with our Resource team to develop and implement fundraising efforts for 2015. Gaining experience in fundraising, grant writing and research is a plus!
- **Grant Administration (1):** This intern will work with the Chief Program Officer to research and apply for grants.

- **Business Intelligence (1):** This is an internship for a student with a unique combination of business and computer science skills. The business intelligence intern will work directly with Family Futures' data analyst, supporting the technological infrastructure and environment of the organization.
- **Biostatistics (1):** This is an internship available for a biostatistics graduate student wishing to gain experience analyzing large data-sets to determine trends, interpret significance in data, and identify correlations and potential causations all related to early childhood research.
- **Neurodevelopment (1):** An unpaid internship opportunity is currently available for a graduate student in Psychology or a related field with an interest in childhood and youth brain development.
- **Interdisciplinary (1):** This a project-based opportunity that allows for a cross-departmental experience. It is highly flexible and requires a significant amount of independence. This position is typically reserved for Masters level students. Examples include data analysis, research and program improvement.
