SUMMARY

WMCAT currently seeks enthusiastic Teaching Professionals to help develop curriculum and lead instruction of Hack Lab, a series of three, one-month survey courses designed to introduce teens to different topics related to computing in February – May 2016. In addition to facilitating experiences in computer programming fundamentals, Hack Lab instructors will also integrate WMCAT's pedagogical approach of design thinking and student-led learning.

The Teen Arts + Tech Program empowers urban teens through a hands-on, design-based curriculum in the visual arts and digital technology. Teaching Professionals will work directly under the Program Director to develop a creative and engaging learning environment that supports our mission of providing a culture of opportunity for people to create economic and social progress in their lives and community.

PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Develop curriculum for the course that builds technical competency and 21st century skills and empowers students to make a positive impact in the community.
- Use a variety of instructional methods to engage students and provide differentiated instruction to meet the needs of students (up to 12 students in a class)
- Provide opportunities for students to reflect on their work and experiences via presentations and peer critiques.
- Keep labs clean, respectful, and inspirational.
- Manage technology and resources, and be fiscally responsible in materials and supply requests.
- Maintain accurate attendance and student performance records and submit reports as requested.
- Maintain a caring, trusting, yet professional relationship with teens.
- Provide supportive, non-discriminant, fair and equal treatment of all students.

PREFERRED EDUCATION/EXPERIENCE

- Minimum of 2-3 years relevant professional experiences in front- or back-end web development, iOS or Android
 development, information security, <u>or</u> user experience *strongly preferred*; professional experiences in other areas
 related to computing *highly desirable*
- Prior teaching experiences in a school or classroom setting with at least 10 students *strongly preferred*
- Bachelor's degree in Computer Science, Information Systems, Design, or a related field *highly desirable*
- Prior related experiences working with teens from diverse cultural backgrounds highly desirable
